

Sugar Glider Instructions

Cleaning the Cage:

1. Lay down paper towels on a flat surface.
2. Take the top off the cage by pinching the sides until they release. When doing this make sure the sugar gliders do not go too far away. Place the top on the paper towels.
3. Take hold of the sugar gliders by the middle of their bodies, make sure you do not have too loose of a hold. **WARNING:** Sugar gliders do have long nails and will scratch! I recommend an adult does this. Gloves can be used. Place them in the cage by lifting up the small green door closest to the bottom.
4. Take the litter and dump it in the trash can. Make sure that you do not dump the white tray in the trash.
5. Once all litter is out, put in new litter, enough to cover the bottom of the white tray.
6. Once done with this, place the top of the cage back on the green bottom.
7. Take a firm grip on the sugar gliders and then place them back in the clean cage. Once again I recommend an adult does this.

Feeding:

1. There is a small zip-lock bag filled with cat food. Take the small yellow container and fill it up to the top. You should check to make sure they has food everyday, but do not fill the container all the way to the top each day.
2. There are two water bottles that are to be emptied and filled again with cold water.

Other things to know:

They are very skittish, so be careful when handling them and keep them near you when the top of the cage is not secure.

If you hold them then you are going to have to be careful because they can glide and scratch. They will normally urinate on you.

These animals are nocturnal, they make noises in the night and play around.
